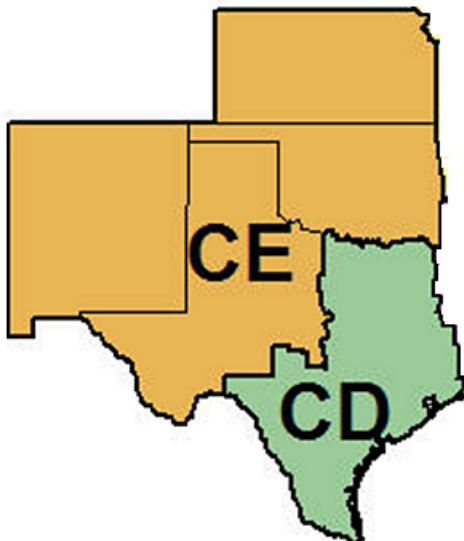

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

To reward the utilization of Best Management Practices and to share in grower risk of losing his/her cotton crop or a serious reduction in yield on the final cotton planting due to drought.

QUALIFYING PRODUCTS	ACTIVITY	ACTION
FiberMax, Stoneville and AFD Cotton Seed Varieties	Yield of less than 150 lbs lint per land acre on qualifying dryland acres	Seed Germplasm refund of 50% of Suggested Grower Price. LibertyLink Technology Fee refund of 100% of Grower Price.

PROGRAM PERIOD

East Texas: May 15, 2009 through November 15, 2009. Remaining Southwest Geography: July 15, 2009 through January 15, 2010.

ELIGIBLE GROWERS

Cotton growers who utilize qualifying products purchased from a Bayer CropScience (BCS) authorized distributor, retailer or agent and whose production area is in Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas.

ELIGIBLE COTTON ACRES

Grower's cotton crop must be eligible for coverage under the Multiple Peril Crop Insurance Program.

PROGRAM ELEMENTS

Growing Practices:

Growers must utilize sound farm management practices, following university extension recommendations and making every attempt to establish a stand and produce a crop to its maximum potential.

General Program Requirements:

The program applies to only dryland acres planted with FiberMax, Stoneville, and/or AFD Cotton Seed.

Best Management Practices established by University Extension Service for local growing region must have been followed:

- Seeding Rate
- Weed Control
- Other Acceptable Farming Practices

PROGRAM ELEMENTS (cont.)

Grower agrees to allow inspection of field by BCS representative.

If fields qualify for program, grower must file a claim with BCS by:

- November 15, 2009 for East Texas
- January 15, 2010 for remaining Southwest geography.

All supporting documentation, proof of seed purchase, insurance documents and gin recaps (if harvested) must be filed with BCS sales representative by reporting deadlines.

Primary cause of Loss must be attributable to drought as noted on FSA Form - PRODUCTION WORKSHEET/PROOF OF LOSS.

LibertyLink Technology Fee Refund Requirements:

Yield must be less than 150 lbs lint/Land Acre for qualifying FiberMax Cotton Seed containing LibertyLink Technology.

If a grower's eligible cotton crop fails due to drought then BCS will reimburse the grower the trait technology fee applicable to purchase of qualified FiberMax Cotton Seed containing LibertyLink Technology.

QUALIFYING GEOGRAPHY MAP FOR DROUGHT PROGRAM

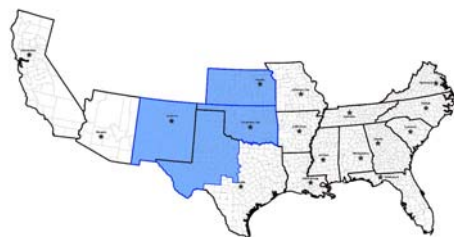

PROGRAM PROCEDURES

All claims procedures from "2009 Shared Risk Program: Cotton Seed Replant and Crop Loss; West Region" apply.

- As part of supporting claims documentation, provide the Bayer CropScience Sales Representative with appropriate documentation including:
 - FSA-578 and Maps
 - PRODUCTION WORKSHEET/PROOF OF LOSS
 - Appraisal Worksheet (if applicable)
 - If destroyed – Certification Form verifying crop was destroyed
 - If harvested – Production Record (503 Form)
- Validation of Seed purchases and planting rate will be conducted prior to processing claim.
- Claims must be completed and submitted to Bayer CropScience by November 15, 2009 (East Texas) or January 15, 2010 (remaining Southwest geography).
